WORK ETHIC'S DARK SIDE

Beware workaholism.

See Gen. 1:31 – 2:3 Ex. 20:9

Regarding your work ethic, ask yourself:

Am I using work to avoid things or relationships that need my time or attention?

Am I seeking my identity in my work to an unhealthy degree (rather than in Christ)?

Is my overzealous work ethic, in fact, a lack of faith? ("Can I really trust Him to provide?" Matt. 6:25-34)

Have I reassigned values, treasuring things of earth over things in Heaven? (See Matt. 6:19-21)
