Matthew 6:25-34

"Therefore" Check the context.

We were just commanded to major in eternal things.

We were warned of the frail nature of temporal things and their inability to truly satisfy.

We also received warning about material possession's desire to rule over us. In that light...

"DO NOT WORRY"

There are bigger things in life than food and drink?

Yep. Not that they aren't important, but we have a Father who loves us. So don't worry.

"Look at the birds"

VS. 26

"Are you not much more valuable than (the birds of the air)?

A huge statement made by the One who created all things, assigning superior value to human life. While a Godless culture would argue that, it is consistent with what we read in God's word. (Gen. 1:26-27)

Again, Jesus has no opinions – only truth

THE FRUITLESSNESS OF WORRY
